

The Words of My Mouth

One of my favorite characters in a TV series is Michael Scott, the manager of Dunder Mifflin (a paper supply company), in the show The Office. Michael Scott is one of the most inept managers in the history of managers. While watching the show, one may wonder how he ever rose to such a position. For example, there was a time when he was enduring some rather serious financial issues, and was told that declaring bankruptcy might be his best way out of his current situation. So, he walks out into the main office area, where everyone can hear him, and yells ... "I declare bankruptcy!"

It's laughable, because of how absurd it was of Michael to think that yelling out something in the midst of others was the "declaration" that was needed. As though his words alone were in any way binding.

Unfortunately, these days, it seems that we have a tendency to treat our words as about as meaningful as someone yelling "I declare bankruptcy!" We use our words to complain, to tear down, to insult, to gossip, to criticize, and more. And, we think nothing of it. We've become so accustomed to hearing and using our words in so many negative ways, that we rarely stop to consider whether or not it's appropriate.

It seems we have forgotten how frequently the Bible warns us to make better use of the words we use...

"Do all things without grumbling or disputing." - Philippians 2:14

"If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless." - James 1:26

"Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear." - Ephesians 4:29

"I tell you, on the day of judgment people will give account for every careless word they speak." - Matthew 12:36

Perhaps we need to think more carefully about the words we are using, and who it affects.
