

Listen
 Hear

Last weekend we got to go to CYC in Pigeon Forge, TN. It was a great experience. Worshiping with nearly 12,000 people from around the country on Sunday, spending time with volunteers and youth group members, and eating our (more than) fair share of junk food over the span of two-ish days was a blast. The theme this year was 'Are You Listening?' Each lesson had its own impact and I think that some of the things that were said hopefully stuck with the teens (and adults) once they got home.

Are you listening? It's a question I got asked quite a bit when I was a kid. It might have seemed like I was paying attention, it might have seemed like I knew what to do, but I hadn't been paying the slightest attention. When it was time for me to respond often my answer was 'Can you say that again?' We've all been there. We know what it's like to not listen...and we know what it's like to not be listened to. We all get tired of having to repeat ourselves.

Imagine what God feels like. In Exodus he gives Moses the Ten Commandments. Do they listen? No. Inevitably they don't. They're supposed to get rid of all the Canaanites when they get to the Promised Land. Do they listen? No. A judge shows up, delivers them, and they stay the course right? No. They might have listened for a little while; but once they thought they heard something better, they moved right on from God not listening to what he had just got done telling them a generation or two earlier.

The listening problem doesn't stop with the Israelites. It continues today. As followers of Christ we're supposed to listen to what he has taught us and apply it daily. Do we? Sometimes it's easy, but sometimes it's easy to put those earbuds in and ignore what God has said. What happens if we don't listen? If we don't listen, we have no chance to understand. If we don't understand, we'll be persuaded to listen to the things of the world. And we're not supposed to be part of this world. Listen.



The God Who Hides

Isaiah declares, "Truly, you are a God who hides himself, O God of Israel, the Savior" (45:15, ESV). But why would God hide? Isn't our knowing God the point? Martin Luther explained that God hides in unexpected places so as not to be found where the world assumes a god would be — in power, status, fame, wealth — but to be found in weakness, humility and places of suffering.



"Those who have found God in the cross of Jesus Christ," said 20th-century theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, "know how wonderfully God hides himself in this world and how he is closest precisely when we believe him to be most distant." So God assures us of his presence in the humble manger, among the poor and outcast during his ministry, in the excruciating suffering of the cross, and with us in every struggle.

God hides not to avoid us but so we will discover him precisely where we need him most, and where others need us most.
