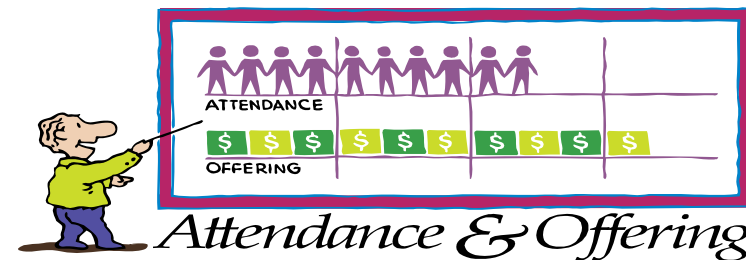

The Heart of Revelation

I know that when I suggested some various topics for my Wednesday night class, there were some who were eager to study the book of Revelation. But, I also know that this particular book is often viewed as a juggernaut that is too difficult to contend with. I'm hoping that, for those of you already involved with the class, you're discovering that the book itself - while challenging at times - isn't the impossible beast you had imagined. And, even more, I hope we are all discovering just how valuable this oft neglected book of God's Word actually is.

For those of you who haven't been able to be a part of the class, (or who may have a tendency to skip the final book of the New Testament in your studies) allow me to share with you one of the many powerful messages of this great writing by the Apostle John.

The book of Revelation is a book that is about perseverance. No matter which interpretation you land on regarding the symbolism in the book, it's easy to see how it is meant to be a message encouraging the original recipients. In fact, one of my favorite phrases in the book is one that is repeated in various ways in every one of the seven letters to the churches that we read about in chapters 2 and 3. The phrase is, "to the one who conquers" (ESV).

You see, the original readers were in for some difficult times ahead. Some had already experienced losses on account of their faith. But, through various words and images, this book is a reminder to be faithful to Jesus to the end. Because everywhere you find the phrase regarding "the one who conquers," you also find a promise. A promise that stretches beyond the challenges of this life. A promise for eternity.

Don't we need the same reminder today? We allow ourselves to worry over so many things in this world. Finances, freedoms, health, children, grandchildren, future, etc. etc. We lose sleep, we get wrapped up in the comparison game, we try to take control of things we have no control over. All the while, needing to be reminded of this great message from the book of Revelation.

Remain faithful to Jesus to the end, trusting in him. That's how we will conquer all our fears. That's how we will be victorious in the end. Think about it.



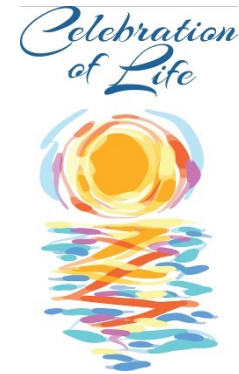

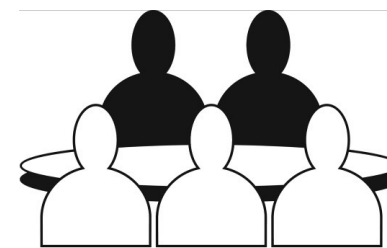
