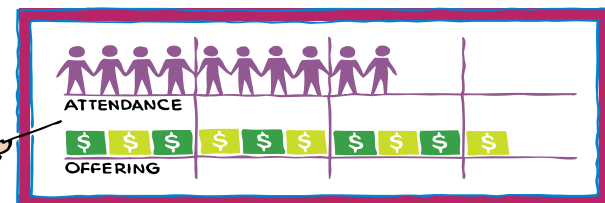

Sunday Evenings

According to Thom Ranier (founder of Church Answers), there are only about 5 percent of churches that have Sunday evening services. The sabbath is set aside for worship and rest. We are told in Hebrews 10:25 not to forsake meeting together and this applies to every time we meet, not just Sunday mornings. One service a week is not much to counter the influences of the world. Church attendance isn't just a box to check off. It is a time to gain knowledge and strengthen our relationship with God. We need more church attendance, not less. Streaming services and home Bible studies are great outreaches but don't replace meeting together to encourage each other.

Sunday evening is a good time to explore different ways of learning more about our God and also allows time for members to encourage and build each other up. Having a Sunday evening service keeps the Lord's day the Lord's day. A day that is truly set apart and not just something to get done at the beginning of the day. I don't feel most people are replacing Sunday evening with spiritual meditation but are spending it watching sports and other programs or catching up on different things and the day of rest and worship quickly slips out of mind.

It is not mandated how many times we should worship together on Sunday but it is evident that first century Christians spent more time worshipping and meeting together than we currently do. The elders, deacons and ministers have all agreed that we should continue to have Sunday night services. We want to have a service that will build up and encourage and strengthen us in our Christian walk. We are also open to suggestions from our church family on ways to improve Sunday evening attendance. We have discussed ways to have more for the younger children during this time. And as parents of our youth members it is important that your children support events such as Sunday evening devotionals planned and hosted by Jackson and our families.

I want to encourage everyone to make worship the top priority on Sundays.
