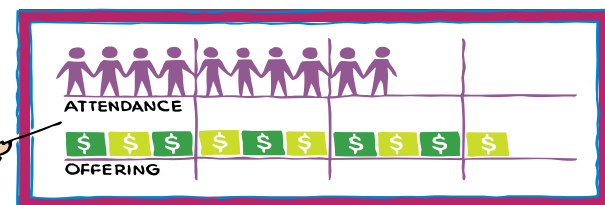

I Wanna Be Like You

One of life's great ironies is just how disappointing it often can be to meet or get to know your heroes. Whether it's your parents whom you thought could do no wrong, or the athlete you pretended to be on the field, or that cool friend or relative that was so different from everyone else. As we grow and mature, and find out more about people, we also find that our heroes are far from infallible. They make mistakes - sometimes really big ones - that we hope to avoid.

I was reminded of this reality while recently watching the old Disney movie, "The Jungle Book." Do you remember the song that the orangutan sang? King Louie was his name, and the song was "I Wanna Be Like You." Louie bemoans the fact that he has pretty much reached his highest potential as a monkey, so he tells the boy, Mowgli, that he wants to learn how to be a human. He wants to walk and talk like humans, and he especially wants to have the ability to create fire like humans.

Doesn't that remind you of being a kid? How badly you wanted to be like some hero of yours? You'd pick up on their mannerisms, or their catch phrases, or even the way they walked. But, there's bound to be a point at which you realize they aren't really who you want to emulate all the time.

In 1 Corinthians 11:1, the apostle Paul is trying to encourage the church to follow his example, in the way that he is constantly seeking the good of others. And, it's here that Paul writes, "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ." If Paul had stopped after the first part of that verse, we would find that rather unappealing. After all, Paul had been a persecutor of Christians, and had made some horrible choices.

But, Paul qualifies his first statement by pointing out that these Christians should imitate him, insofar as he is imitating Jesus. Heroes in this life are going to disappoint us. They're going to make poor, ungodly choices. So, if we're going to imitate *anyone* - if you wanna be like *anyone* - it ought to be Jesus Christ.

How are you doing with that lately? Have you been imitating the attitudes and actions of Jesus? Or have you been caught up in living and acting like someone else? Think about it...
