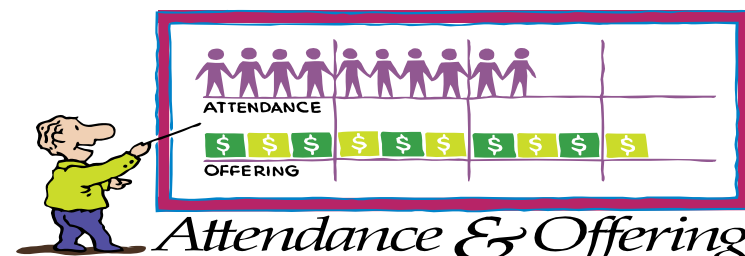

It's a rematch of the 2020 Super Bowl. Chiefs vs. 49ers. Mahomes, Kelce, and Taylor up against Purdy, McCaffery, and Kittle. Who will take home the Lombardi? It's hard to escape the world of football here in America. Chances are someone has asked you, 'Who do you think is going to win?' or 'Do you think Taylor Swift will be in the halftime show?' It's everywhere. Prequels to multi-million-dollar commercials are streaming on youtube, people are spending insane amounts of money for a last minute ticket, and NFL Sunday Ticket is already offering a discount for next season's pass. Besides football, one word comes to mind when I think of the game that decides the champion of the NFL: money.

Some estimates speculate that over the span of a year this single game is responsible for generating \$1.3 billion. ONE GAME. And it generates that much money. I've already used this adjective, but I think it's worth using again. Insane. The only way this vast sum is generated is the public interest in the game, the commercials, and the half-time show. Interest from the public drives the growth, growth encourages more people to spend more money, spending more money makes it more likely to appeal to more people, thus the interest continues to grow. If you're in the business of making money it's a beautiful cycle. What can we learn from it?

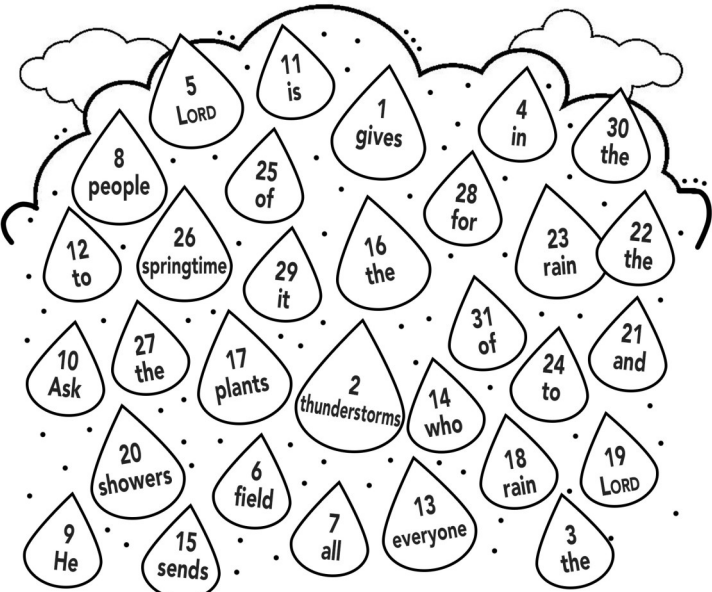
As much as I love football, I love Jesus more. I am interested in learning about his teaching, how he wants us to live, and I'm interested in sharing him with others. My hope is that those that I share Jesus with develop the same interests that I do. They'll want to learn about him and share about him too. And hopefully some sort of cycle will be formed in which new people are getting interested in learning who Jesus is because there's such a general interest in what he teaches. To a large degree this has already happened. There was a time when Christianity was seemingly synonymous with being a citizen of the United States. That's not the case anymore. There are other things that compete for the attention of everyone, me and you included, that completely ignore the doctrine of Christ. What that means is we're going to have to work hard at convincing others that Christ is a big deal. He's a lifetime event. He generates more than just money. He gives us hope. He gives us peace. He gives us a home in heaven. He helps us raise our kids. He helps us structure our household and our finances. He helps us love those whom we might disagree with. He gives us and helps us with so much, yet we often forget that he does.

In Matthew 28 Jesus is speaking to his disciples after his resurrection and in the second half of verse 20 he says, "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Not just for one day, not just for one event, but for every day till the end of time. When we fully understand the value of that, these \$1.3 billion expenditures don't compare at all to the glory we have in Christ. My guess is the Chiefs win, 31-27. But I know Jesus wins every single time.

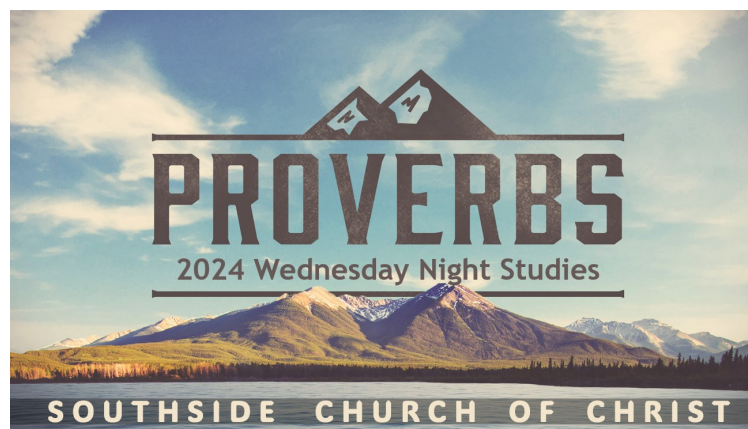
