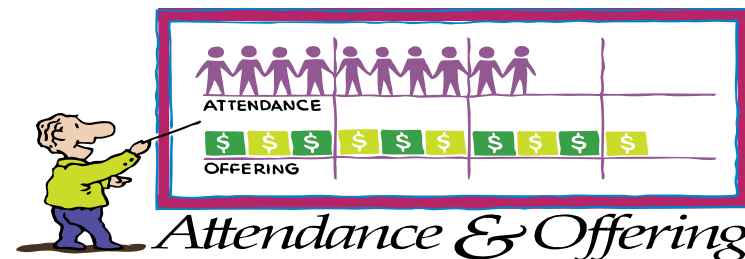

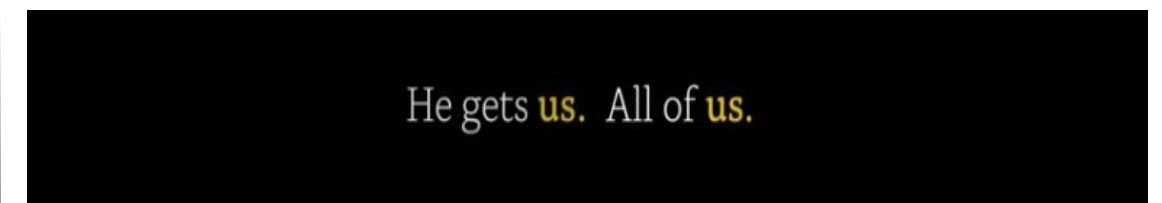
### Was Jesus at the Super Bowl?

Last week's big game was viewed live by over 120 million people, setting an all-time worldwide television viewership record for any Super Bowl event. As my family and I watched and cheered over the competition, admiring the exceptional athleticism of the players, a funny thing happened.

Jesus made an appearance...well, not exactly...but part of His teaching was indeed the main thrust of a now viral commercial which juxtaposes many different factions and elements of our society while imploring people to realize that Jesus is man of love, not hate. There were no Scriptures quoted, no audible words, no depiction of Jesus Himself, just a series of evocative images laid behind a backdrop cover song by artist Jenn Mundia entitled "Never Tear Us Apart." Despite the song's title, this commercial has sparked controversy and has drawn complaints from nearly every side; it seems the devil would like to use it to further tear people apart from one another, and also to obfuscate the message and ministry of Jesus.

The 1 minute, \$17.5million advertisement depicts the distinctively Christian act of washing others' feet (from John 13) in a series of still frames showing people who normally are considered to be 'in opposition' to one another practicing this humble act: a son-in law washing his father-in law, a cop washing the alley dweller, a cheerleader washing the less popular girl, a cowboy washing the Indian, a woman washing the pregnant teen, a sober girl washing the addicted drunk, an oil rig worker washing the environmentalist, a suburban housewife washing the border-crossers bussed to Chicago, Muslims being washed, individuals crossing protest lines – amid the yelling - stop to sit and wash, an older black guy and white guy sharing a foot soak, and finally a priest washing the transgendered.

The now familiar following caption closed out the commercial:



It is true that Jesus 'gets us' - John 2:24 says that Jesus knows what is inside of us, that He knows all about every single human. This is the very reason He came, to save sinners. So, yes He gets us...but, the more important thing to consider is: **Do we 'get' Him?** Do we understand Him, His washing, His mission, His call for repentance, His salvation? Do the viewers know what His life, death and resurrection mean?

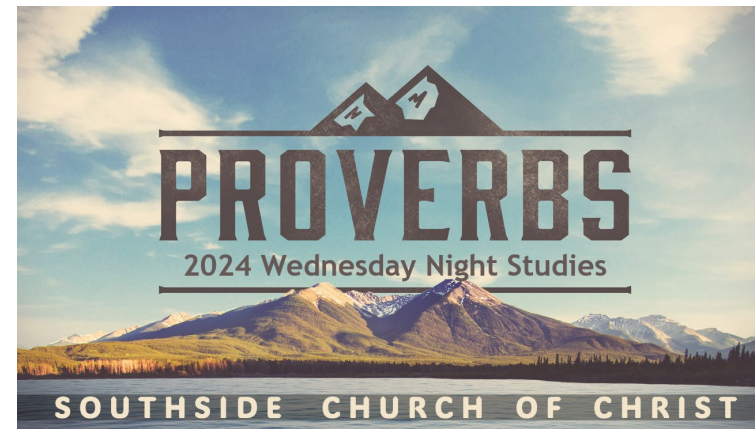
